





Deforestation-free supply chains



Aspect	EUTR	Regulation deforestation-free supply chains (Draft 17.11.2021)
Treatment of FLEGT and CITES goods	Excluded from the EUTR	FLEGT commodities meet the legality criteria, but deforestation still needs to be assessed. For CITES commodities, both legality and deforestation must be verified
Testing requirements for authorities	Authorities to carry out controls	Authorities must inspect 5% of all imports and 15% of all imports from high-risk countries annually
Justified concerns of third parties (e.g. NGOs)	Can lead to official audits	Authorities <u>must</u> follow up on reasonable concerns
Legal action for third parties	Not foreseen	Anyone with a legitimate interest (e.g. NGOs) has the right to challenge decisions of the authorities in court




Conclusion:

ETTF welcomes the fact that the most significant polluters of global forest degradation are being held accountable.

Aber:

- Even for export or sale to large companies within the supply chain: due diligence system
 - additional bureaucracy,
 - Supply chain disclosure,
 - The EUTR has shown that importers are able to implement due diligence well and that additional downstream checks are unnecessary.
- A blanket demand for GPS coordinates of all land parcels is hardly feasible
 - Wood-based materials!
 - Senseless, with limited traceability





- ✓ Target: CO2 reduction 55% by 2030 "fit for 55"
- ✓ Timber industry represents 20% of the manufacturing companies in the domestic market,
 3.6 million jobs, 640 billion € turnover



New EU Forest Strategy 2030 / EU Biodiversity Directive




- Planting 3 MRD additional trees by 2030 (Spruce 3000/ha = 3 million ha/10 TSD/member)
- ✓ Transition from short-lived to long-lived wood use
- ✓ New European Bauhaus
- ✓ European forestry associations are up in arms
- Timber industry alerts of considerable supply bottlenecks if proposals are strictly implemented

Change in turnover in % compared to previous year (weighted)











